- Must be physically able to meet the demands of the job, such as lifting/transferring (if necessary), personal care supports (if necessary), participating in a variety of activities within the community.
- Able to adapt and accommodate to individual needs without prejudice or influence.
- Willing to be a team player and supportive co-worker.
- Positive, pleasant work attitude, effective communication skills and a great work ethic.
- Class 4 driver's license (preferred) or a class 5 driver's license (accepted). If you possess a class 7 driver's license you <u>MUST</u> be able to obtain your Class 5 license within 6 months of hire.
- Other CSCL employment criteria required <u>BEFORE</u> hire (Criminal Record Check Clearance, Medical/Health Certificate Clearance, Proof of Full Covid Vaccination) and <u>AFTER</u> hire (Emergency/Occupational First Aid Certificate with CPR, Caring about Food Safety/Food Safe Certificate)
